



Keels & Wheels Concours d'Elegance May 2nd and 3rd, 2015 By Di Johnson


Texas Chapter members who entered boats in competition at the 2015 Keels and Wheels Concours d'Elegance classic car and boat show were as follows:

Annual Lake Catherine Wet Meet May 15th Through 18th, 2015 By Di Johnson


Lake Catherine State Park has some great cabins in the woods. The scenery is absolutely magnificent!




